State Nonpublic Textbook & Technology Program

In 2021-2022, \$51,740 in state funds was used to obtain new textbooks and online resources for the Mathematics and Social Studies department. Additionally, the school was able to cover software licensing costs for the computer labs and get a new chromebook cart for student use. For several years, Maryland's Nonpublic Textbook Program has provided tremendous support in allowing DeMatha purchase books and improve technology in the school without any additional student fees. 


