Principal Notes:

Our faculty summer reading has been a demanding work on the philosophy of teaching called To Know As We Are Known: Education as Spiritual Journey by Parker Palmer. I have been wrestling with this book for several years now and I really appreciate the indulgence of my colleagues in their reading of it and helping me think through it.

One important claim that Palmer makes is that "to learn is to face transformation." This can be profoundly disturbing—no one objects to being "transformed" by knowing how the Krebs Cycle works or by how to use the quadratic equation. But, to face transformation of our assumptions or our long-held ideas through a confrontation with a character in a book or an event in history or a theological truth—that can be profound. And still, we should make ourselves vulnerable to these transformations as we work our way to the truth.

It can be scary but it is the only way that we achieve the freedom we are called to by our faith and by our liberal art education.

This year like all the 41 before it (for me), I expect to be transformed by texts and relationships. We are a theotropic people—we grow towards God—and that means we change.

Transportation Matters

Five bus routes have been established: 1) Annapolis/Bowie, 2) Dunkirk/Upper Marlboro, 3) Charles

County/Ft. Washington, 4)
Montgomery County and 5) Clinton/
Forestville/Eastern Market. Each of
the established routes operate with
predetermined pick-up and drop-off
locations with adjustments made for
the safety of the students. Interested
individuals must complete a
registration form which can be found
on the school website

www.DeMatha.org - and include a \$100 non-refundable registration fee. Routes, as used this past year, may be updated and confirmation of the routes and schedules for the current year will be published on the website before August 23. Bus fees will be \$2400 for both ways and \$1340 for one way (in addition to the \$100 non -refundable registration fee). Expect quarterly payments at the beginning of each academic quarter.
