

# **Principal Notes**

I mentioned last month that I have been thinking "attention economy" and I plan to expand on that a little bit.

Some of the only times I see students without a device in their hands or EarPods in is when they are playing a sport, or in the fitness center, or in music—ideally not while they are in class but I have caught more than a few "just checking the time" or "seeing what my mom wants."

What links the spaces when I don't see devices and EarPods are places that require physical and mental attention and discipline. Ironically, those places are often thought of as less important academically. There is only so much attention, time, we can give in a day. What happens to our ability to focus or pay attention if that is constantly degraded by devices? What happens to our ability to be in community if we are in protective cocoons of our own making? I don't think we have the answers to theses things, though the early data looks scary.

Maybe this Lenten Season we can turn our attention to some of these questions. I think I will have a bit more to say about this in April's DeMatha Matters.

### Academic Matters Summer Session

School regulations stipulate that any failing grade must be made up in summer school. Students are also required to attend summer school if they meet one of the following criteria: a final grade of F in any class; a grade of D in Algebra 1, Part 1; Algebra 1, Part 2; regular Algebra 1, or Algebra 2. A grade of D in Honors Algebra 1 or Honors Algebra 2 does not result in required summer school. Instead, the student will move out of the honors math program. A grade of D in the first two levels of a world language also requires remediation in summer school. If a student achieves an extremely low final grade, he may be required to repeat the course the following year depending on individual academic department regulations. DeMatha makes every attempt to remediate failed classes. Please check the website for summer session offerings beginning April 1. Please take the summer school dates into consideration when making vacation plans. Summer

school: Tuesday, June 20 – Thursday, July 20. Failure to make up a class in summer school will result in a \$400 fee being assessed in the fall for administrative and scheduling purposes.

# Asbestos & Lead Monitoring



Several times a year, the facilities of DeMatha are in-

spected to ensure that our buildings meet all requirements with respect to the containment and abatement of asbestos covered surfaces (pipes, floor tiles, etc.). DeMatha fully complies with all environmental laws and regulations mandated by state and federal regulations with regard to AHERA. Copies of inspection reports and AHE-RA compliance documents are available in the Main Office during normal business hours. Additionally, as mandated by MD state law, all drinking water supplies have been inspected for lead and found to be in compliance with state regulations.

Asbestos inspections occur every 6 months internally and an independent inspection from an outside source occurs every 2 years.

All water outlets are sampled and analyzed by an independent state approved laboratory every 3 years. All buildings are monitored for mold throughout the year. Testing and mitigation occur on an as needed basis.
